

Tokyo 2020 chief rules out postponing **Olympics**

The president of the Tokyo

2020 organizing committee ruled out a cancellation or further postponement of the Olympics as doubts grew among officials of city governments and medical experts whether the event can be held safely amid the pandemic.

- 1. The head of Japan's Olympic committee on Thursday ruled out cancelling the Summer Games in Tokyo amid swirling doubts from medical and sports officials.
- 2. Seiko Hashimoto confirmed in an interview published by Nikkan Sports that Tokyo 2020 will go on as planned.
- 3. She said: "We cannot postpone again."
- 4. Although, there will be restrictions in place.
- 5. Athletes can expect to be regularly tested and foreign spectators are barred from attending the events.
- 5. It's yet to be decided if Japanese fans will be allowed into venues.
- 6. Public opinion polls in Japan have consistently shown that a majority want the Games cancelled - or, postponed for a second time.
- 7. Japan is battling a fourth wave of infections, just two months from the scheduled start of the Games.
- 8. Ten regions including Tokyo are under a state of emergency until near the end of this month.
- 9. The country's vaccination rollout has also been slow, with only about 3 percent of the population inoculated.

10. Japan's Asahi Shimbun newspaper also reported Thursday that Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga is likely to call a snap election after the Games, showing his resolve to push ahead with the event.
